The Facilities Maintenance Technician plays a crucial role in ensuring that our environments remain safe, functional, and welcoming for residents, staff, and visitors. The Facilities Maintenance Technician will report to the Executive Director and collaborate with other team members to ensure the organization's goals are met.

Key Responsibilities:

• General Maintenance:

- Conduct routine inspections of the maternity home and office facilities to identify and address maintenance needs.
- Perform repairs and maintenance tasks, including plumbing, electrical systems,
 HVAC units, and structural components.
